


During August and September 2022, a total of nine potato producing regions as well as nonproducing suppliers delivered potatoes nationally to fresh produce markets.


Average percentage downgraded: 9%.

Figure 1: Classes inspected during August/September 2022 at all fresh produce markets.












Figure 3: Potatoes downgraded (%) per region at fresh produce markets during August/ September 2022.

WC Ceres, Southwestern Free State, KwaZulu-Natal and Mpumalanga had no downgrades.




Figure 4: Reasons for downgrading at all fresh produce markets during August/September 2022.

Others include: Wet decay, insect damage, hollow heart, broken and cut tubers, wilt, skin eelworm, rhizoctonia, dry stem-end, collectively too big and small, sprouts, brown fleck, tomato spotted wilt virus, too big, soiled, cold damage, soiled decay, glassiness/watery, vascular browning, wet by decayed tubers, watergrass damage (external).




Figure 5: Cultivar varieties inspected at all fresh produce markets during August/September 2022.




Figure 6: Volumes inspected at all fresh produce markets during August/September 2022.
